New Additions

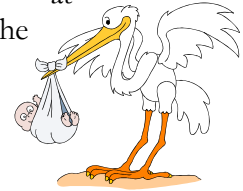

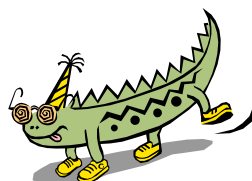
After a fifteen year battle and two miracle babies later, **Lisa** had a full hysterectomy. Recovery is going well and things are just about back to normal in the **Perry** household.

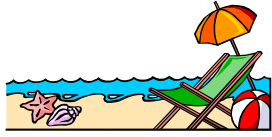
